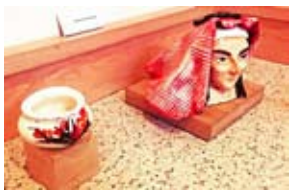




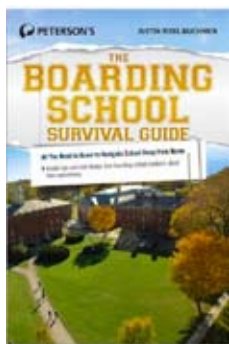

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5th annual Forward In Health service learning opportunity

Spring break was a busy one this year for the Winchendon students who traveled to Haiti for another service learning trip in support of the **Forward In Health** clinic. This year's is the fifth one since Winchendon began its collaboration with Forward in Health.

It's always an amazing experience for all involved. This year, in addition to helping out with healthcare responsibilities at the clinic, the students also spent time at Mother Teresa's Sisters of Charity orphanage, painted a classroom, engaged in arts and crafts with local youngsters, visited a waterfall that produces electricity for the surrounding area, and talked to the Haitian youth about the importance of staying in school. Winchendon teacher Fiona Byrne accompanied the students on the trip. **Forward in Health** was founded by John Mulqueen, M.D., and his wife Paula Mulqueen, who are the parents of current Winchendon student Conor Mulqueen '15.
